Senate Resolution No. 76: A Senate resolution eulogizing and commemorating the life and dedicated service to the State of Minnesota of former Minnesota Governor C. Elmer Anderson.

WHEREAS, C. Elmer Anderson was born in Brainerd, Minnesota, on March 16, 1912, the seventh in a family of nine children of Swedish immigrants Fred and Anna Anderson; and

WHEREAS, the former paper boy from Brainerd became governor of the state in 1951 and served the state with unquestionable integrity and devotion as governor until 1955; and

WHEREAS, C. Elmer Anderson was elected lieutenant governor in 1938 at age 26 joining Governor Harold Stassen on the youngest ticket in state history, and he went on to serve the State of Minnesota as lieutenant governor for a total of six terms and 10-1/2 years, more than anyone else in Minnesota history; and

WHEREAS, C. Elmer Anderson continued his distinguished career in government by first becoming mayor of Nisswa from 1961 to 1965 and then being elected mayor of Brainerd in December 1975, where he took the oath of office flat on his back in St. Joseph's Hospital while recuperating from a broken hip, and was subsequently elected to four more terms; and

WHEREAS, C. Elmer Anderson's last tie to public service was his membership on the Minnesota Racing Commission, which granted the state's first horse racing license to Canterbury Downs in Shakopee; and

WHEREAS, C. Elmer Anderson will be fondly remembered for his love of government, his conscientious work, commitment to family, and unquestionable integrity; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the State of Minnesota recognizes the exemplary professional service provided by C. Elmer Anderson to the State of Minnesota; and extends its condolences to his wife Lillian, his children, and to all of his friends and relatives; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Senate is directed to prepare an enrolled copy of this resolution, to be authenticated by his signature and that of the chair of the Senate Rules and Administration Committee, and that it is presented to the family of C. Elmer Anderson.
