FIRST READING OF HOUSE BILLS

No. 2523: A bill for an act relating to rulemaking; making rules effective only after approval by the governor or a constitutional officer, as appropriate; removing the governor's veto authority over rules; amending Minnesota Statutes 2000, section 14.05, by adding a subdivision; repealing Minnesota Statutes 2001 Supplement, section 14.05, subdivision 6.

Referred to the Committee on State and Local Government Operations.

H.F. No. 2695: A bill for an act relating to retirement; correcting Minneapolis firefighters relief association provisions; amending certain administrative procedures; amending Minnesota Statutes 2001 Supplement, sections 423C.01, subdivisions 17, 25; 423C.03, subdivisions 4, 6; 423C.04, subdivisions 1, 4; 423C.05, subdivisions 5, 6, 7, 9.

Referred to the Committee on Rules and Administration for comparison with S.F. No. 2531, now on the Consent Calendar.

H.F. No. 3062: A bill for an act relating to the courts; repealing limitations on the term of service for judges in Hennepin and Ramsey county juvenile courts; repealing Minnesota Statutes 2000, section 260.019, subdivisions 2, 3, 4.

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Referred to the Committee on Rules and Administration for comparison with S.F. No. 2839, now on the Consent Calendar.

S.F. No. 3189: A bill for an act relating to local government; establishing a retroactive effective date for St. Paul civil service separation.

Reports the same back with the recommendation that the bill do pass and be placed on the Consent Calendar. Report adopted.

Senator Vickerman from the Committee on State and Local Government Operations, to which was referred

S.F. No. 2403: A bill for an act relating to finance; authorizing the Minneapolis park and recreation board to lease certain property for the repayment of certain state bond expenditures.

Reports the same back with the recommendation that the bill do pass. Report adopted.

Senator Vickerman from the Committee on State and Local Government Operations, to which was referred

S.F. No. 3117: A bill for an act relating to the metropolitan council; providing for the transfer or disposal of interceptor facilities; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 473.

Reports the same back with the recommendation that the bill do pass. Report adopted.

Senator Vickerman from the Committee on State and Local Government Operations, to which was referred

S.F. No. 3069: A bill for an act relating to state and local government; requiring the state and local governmental units to give public notice before transferring ownership or changing the use of publicly owned undeveloped land; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 465.

Reports the same back with the recommendation that the bill do pass. Report adopted.

Senator Vickerman from the Committee on State and Local Government Operations, to which was referred

S.F. No. 3132: A bill for an act relating to land use management; authorizing the northern counties land use coordinating board to initiate a pilot project to promote cooperative efforts among county, state, federal, and local units of government, and with Canadian officials regarding land use management issues.

No. 2877: A bill for an act relating to human services; placing a moratorium on the establishment, licensure, and public financing of large institutions for children; requiring a study on children and families whose needs are not being met by the current child welfare or social services systems.

S.F. No. 3124: A bill for an act relating to health; modifying resident reimbursement classifications; amending Minnesota Statutes 2001 Supplement, section 144.0724, subdivisions 3, 5, 7, 9.

Reports the same back with the recommendation that the bill be amended as follows:

Page 2, line 8, delete "tube feeding,"

Page 5, line 3, before "to" insert "by reporting"

Page 6, line 20, before "to" insert "by reporting"

Page 9, after line 6, insert:

"Sec. 5. Minnesota Statutes 2000, section 144A.04, subdivision 7, is amended to read:

Subd. 7. [MINIMUM NURSING STAFF REQUIREMENT.] Notwithstanding the provisions of Minnesota Rules, part 4655.5600, the minimum staffing standard for nursing personnel in certified nursing homes is as follows:

(a) The minimum number of hours of nursing personnel to be provided in a nursing home is the greater of two hours per resident per 24 hours or 0.95 hours per standardized resident day. Upon transition to the 34 group, RUG-III resident classification system, the 0.95 hours per standardized resident day shall no longer apply.

(b) For purposes of this subdivision, "hours of nursing personnel" means the paid, on-duty, productive nursing hours of all nurses and nursing assistants, calculated on the basis of any given 24-hour period. "Productive nursing hours" means all on-duty hours during which nurses and nursing assistants are engaged in nursing duties. Examples of nursing duties may be found in Minnesota Rules, parts 4655.5900, 4655.6100, and 4655.6400. Not included are vacations, holidays, sick leave, in-service classroom training, or lunches. Also not included are the nonproductive nursing hours of the in-service training director. In homes with more than 60 licensed beds, the hours of the director of nursing are excluded. "Standardized resident day" means the sum of the number of residents in each case mix class multiplied by the case mix weight for that resident class, as found in Minnesota Rules, part 9549.0059, subpart 2, calculated on the basis of a facility's census for any given day. For the purpose of determining a facility for resident therapeutic leave or bed hold days.

(c) Calculation of nursing hours per standardized resident day is performed by dividing total hours of nursing personnel for a given period by the total of standardized resident days for that same period.

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(d) A nursing home that is issued a notice of noncompliance under section 144A.10, subdivision 5, for a violation of this subdivision, shall be assessed a civil fine of \$300 for each day of noncompliance, subject to section 144A.10, subdivisions 7 and 8."

Amend the title as follows:

Page 1, line 3, after the semicolon, insert "clarifying minimum nursing staff requirements;" and after "amending" insert "Minnesota Statutes 2000, section 144A.04, subdivision 7;"

And when so amended the bill do pass. Amendments adopted. Report adopted.

Senator Anderson from the Committee on Jobs, Housing and Community Development, to which was referred

S.F. No. 2456: A bill for an act relating to employment; amending the definition of a child for the purposes of parenting leave requirements; amending Minnesota Statutes 2000, section 181.940, subdivision 4.

Reports the same back with the recommendation that the bill be amended as follows:

Delete everything after the enacting clause and insert:

"Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2000, section 181.9412, is amended by adding a subdivision to read:

Subd. 1a. [FOSTER CHILD.] For the purpose of this section, "child" includes a foster child."

Delete the title and insert:

"A bill for an act relating to employment; providing school conference and activity leave for foster parents; amending Minnesota Statutes 2000, section 181.9412, by adding a subdivision."

And when so amended the bill do pass. Amendments adopted. Report adopted.

Page 2, line 15, reinstate the stricken "the applicant's benefit year shall be" and after the stricken "one-half of" insert "equal to" and reinstate the stricken "the"

Page 2, line 16, reinstate the stricken language

Page 2, line 17, reinstate the stricken language and delete the new language

Page 2, lines 18 and 19, delete the new language

Amend the title as follows:

Page 1, delete line 4

Page 1, line 5, delete "subdivision 19;" and insert "amending"
