INTRODUCTION AND FIRST READING OF SENATE BILLS

The following bills were read the first time.

Senator Latz introduced--

S.F. No. 2517: A bill for an act relating to public safety; assigning prosecutorial authority for peace-officer-involved deaths to the attorney general; appropriating money; amending Minnesota Statutes 2020, sections 8.01; 388.051, subdivision 1; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 8.

Referred to the Committee on Judiciary and Public Safety Finance and Policy.

Senator Pappas introduced--

S.F. No. 2518: A bill for an act relating to capital investment; amending an appropriation for a grant to Hennepin County for Phase 1 of the Avivo regional career and employment center project in Minneapolis; amending Laws 2020, Fifth Special Session chapter 3, article 1, section 21, subdivision 23.

Referred to the Committee on Capital Investment.

Senators Pratt and Rarick introduced--

S.F. No. 2519: A bill for an act relating to workforce development; establishing a Legislative-Citizen Committee on Workforce Development; requiring reports; amending Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 116L.20, subdivision 2; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 116J.

Referred to the Committee on Jobs and Economic Growth Finance and Policy.

Senator Bakk introduced--

S.F. No. 2520: A bill for an act relating to capital investment; appropriating money for a wastewater treatment facility in Babbitt; authorizing the sale and issuance of state bonds.

Senator Gazelka, for Senator Draheim, moved that the Senate do not concur in the amendments by the House to S.F. No. 1470, and that a Conference Committee of 3 members be appointed by the Subcommittee on Conference Committees on the part of the Senate, to act with a like Conference Committee appointed on the part of the House. The motion prevailed.
