FIRST DAY

St. Paul, Minnesota, Tuesday, January 3, 2023

This being the day designated by the Constitution and Laws of the State of Minnesota for the assembling of the Legislature, the Senators-elect met in the Senate Chamber of the Capitol and were called to order at 12 o'clock noon by the Lieutenant Governor, Peggy Flanagan.

Prayer was offered by the Chaplain, Rev. Dr. DeWayne Davis.
